From Sunset to Sunrise : The Sacred Journey of Chhath Puja



Day 1

Nahay-Khay: The Beginning of Purity

Nahay-Khay: The Beginning of Purity

Chhath Puja begins with Nahay-Khay, a day dedicated to cleansing and sanctity. Devotees take a holy bath and prepare a pure, satvik meal — often rice, bottle gourd (lauki) cooked in ghee, and chana dal. The kitchen becomes a sacred space, and this simple, unadulterated meal marks the start of the vrat (fast). Nahay-Khay symbolizes entering the festival with a purified body, mind, and soul.

In Jamshedpur, Chhath Puja is not just a religious ritual; it is a festival that brings the entire community together. Days before the festival, people come together to clean riverbanks, prepare ghats, and decorate the surroundings, turning these spaces into vibrant centres of collective devotion. As the sun rises and sets, thousands of devotees gather with offerings in hand to offer arghya to Surya Dev, filling the air with faith, chants, and quiet reverence. The Swarnarekha and Kharkai river ghats, Domuhani Ghat, and Dimna Lake transform into sacred landscapes during this time. Equally captivating is the grand celebration at Surya Mandir, Sidhgora, where Chhath Puja is observed with remarkable devotion and scale, reflecting the deep cultural roots and unity that define the festival in the city.



Kharna: A Ritual of Discipline & Gratitude

The second day, Kharna, reflects deep discipline and devotion. After observing a strict day-long fast without water, devotees prepare a sacred prasada — gur ki kheer (jaggery rice pudding), rice chapati (roti), and bananas. This offering is first dedicated to the divine and then shared with neighbors and family as a symbol of harmony. After this meal, the rigorous 36-hour nirjala fast begins, demonstrating extraordinary spiritual strength.

Sandhya Arghya: The Evening Offering to the Setting Sun

As dusk paints the sky in golden and crimson shades, devotees gather at riverbanks or water bodies to offer Sandhya Arghya to the setting sun. The traditional soop (woven bamboo tray) is filled with offerings like thekua, seasonal fruits, sugarcane, coconuts, and diyas. Standing in waist-deep water, devotees pour arghya from brass lotas, expressing gratitude for life, energy, and well-being. The glowing lamps and collective prayers create one of the most breathtaking scenes of the festival.



Day 3

Sandhya Arghya: The Evening Offering to the Setting Sun

Usha Arghya: The Morning Salutation to a New Beginning

The final day marks Usha Arghya — the offering to the rising sun. Before dawn, devotees prepare the same soop with thekua, rice laddoos, bananas, and other prasada items. As the first rays touch the horizon, they offer their prayers to Usha, the goddess of the morning light. This arghya symbolizes hope, new beginnings, and the culmination of days of devotion and endurance.
