



#### St. Mary's Church in Bistupur, Jamshedpur




#### Beldih Baptist Church , Northern Town

In our **Shakshatkar** segment, we feature **Mr. Roushan Kumar**, Founder and Director of **Gowar Craft LLP**, a sustainability-driven startup based in Ranchi, Jharkhand. An alumnus of IIM Kolkata, he is dedicated to creating eco-friendly products from indigenous cow dung while empowering rural women through skill development and entrepreneurship. Having trained over 400 women, Mr. Kumar blends tradition with innovation to promote environmental sustainability and social impact. His journey reflects a strong commitment to community development, ethical business practices, and building a greener future- making him an inspiring example for young entrepreneurs and socially conscious youth.

**Q** *What inspired you to start an eco-friendly venture centered around indigenous cow dung products?*

**A** The idea came very organically. I grew up seeing how much potential villages actually have, but it often goes unnoticed. On one side, indigenous cows were not getting proper care, especially the non-milking ones. On the other side, rural women wanted work that they could start immediately without big investment. When I realized cow dung could be turned into useful, eco-friendly products, everything connected.

It felt like a solution that could help both women and cows at the same time, so Gowar Craft was born.

**Q** *How do you blend traditional practices with modern innovation in your products?*

**A** We don't change the essence of the traditional process — we still use desi cow dung, natural ingredients, and handcrafting. But we've added better designs, moulds, and finishing techniques to make the products look modern and premium. So our diyas, idols, incense, and gifting items still carry the traditional feel, but the quality is something today's customers expect.

**Q** *What challenges did you face while introducing eco-friendly alternatives in the market?*

**A** In the beginning, the main challenge was trust. People simply couldn't believe that cow dung could be used to make high-quality products like diyas, idols, decor pieces, planters, logs, or even paint and paper. We had to show real samples and run small trials. Once people saw the finish and quality, their doubts slowly disappeared.

**Q** *You have trained over 400 rural women- what has this journey been like?*

**A** Honestly, it has been one of the best parts of this work. We've trained women in different places - Ranchi, Deoghar, Nawada, Anand and other clusters. Many of them had never made anything like this before. Seeing them become confident and start earning from day one has been very motivating for us.

**Q** *What changes have you observed in the lives of the women associated with your initiative?*

**A** The income matters, of course, but what stands out is their confidence. Some women who used to be very shy now confidently take

orders, handle production, and talk about their work. Many of them can now support their families in small ways, and that creates a big emotional shift.

**Q** *What advice would you give to the students who wish to start their own venture?*

**A** Don't overthink the idea too much. Start small, test it, talk to people, and learn from your users. Perfection comes later. Consistency is the real game changer.

**Q** *In what ways can young people actively participate in creating a more sustainable and environmentally responsible future?*

**A** Small changes make a big difference- choosing eco-friendly products, reducing waste, and supporting local artisans. Even simple things like switching to natural puja items can create a positive impact. If young people change their lifestyle a little, it influences the whole ecosystem.

**Q** *Did you ever face self-doubt? How did you overcome it?*

**A** Of course- many times. Whenever you try something new, doubts come naturally. What helped me was focusing on the impact. When a woman earns her first income or when customers appreciate our work, it reminds me that we're moving in the right direction. Taking things one day at a time also helps a lot.

## The Gap Between Student Expectations and Industry Expectations : A Career Readiness Challenge

### Introduction

In today's rapidly evolving job market, one of the most persistent challenges faced by graduates is the mismatch between what students expect from their careers and what industries actually demand. While students enter the workforce with aspirations of quick success, high salaries, and meaningful roles, employers often seek job-ready professionals who possess practical skills, adaptability, and professional maturity. This gap between student expectations and industry expectations has significant implications for employability, retention, and long-term career growth.

### Student Expectations

Many students view academic qualifications as the primary determinant of career success. They often expect:

- Immediate placement in well-paying roles after graduation
- Clear job roles with rapid promotions
- Minimal on-the-job learning
- Work that aligns closely with their field of study
- Flexible working conditions and quick recognition

These expectations are influenced by peer comparisons, social media narratives, campus placement success stories, and limited exposure to real workplace environments.

### Industry Expectations

On the other hand, employers prioritize practical readiness over theoretical knowledge. Industry expectations typically include:

- Strong communication and interpersonal skills
- Problem-solving ability and critical thinking
- Willingness to learn and adapt to change
- Professional attitude, discipline, and work ethics
- Hands-on skills relevant to the role
- Ability to work in teams and handle pressure

Organizations expect fresh graduates to contribute productively after initial training and show long-term potential rather than immediate perfection.

### Key Areas of the Gap

#### 1. Skills vs. Degrees

Students often believe that a degree guarantees employment, whereas industries emphasize skill application, industry exposure, and continuous learning.

#### 2. Salary Expectations

Graduates frequently expect high starting salaries, while employers focus on entry-level compensation linked to skill level, productivity, and growth potential.

#### 3. Work Culture and Discipline

many students are unprepared for structured work environments, deadlines, performance reviews, and accountability expected in professional settings.

#### 4. Learning Curve

Students expect stability early in their careers, but industries expect them to learn, experiment, and sometimes fail while adapting to organizational needs.

#### 5. Career Growth Perspective

Students may seek quick promotions, while industries value consistency, performance, and long-term contribution.

### Consequences of the Gap

The mismatch leads to several challenges:

- Graduate unemployment or underemployment
- High attrition rates among fresh hires
- Employer dissatisfaction with entry-level talent
- Frustration and demotivation among students
- Increased training costs for organizations

### Bridging the Gap

To reduce this disconnect, a collaborative approach is essential:

- **Academic Institutions** should integrate industry-oriented curricula, internships, live projects, and soft-skill training.
- **Students** must focus on skill development, realistic career planning, and experiential learning alongside academics.
- **Industry** can engage through guest lectures, mentorship programs, internships, and curriculum inputs.
- **Career Guidance Cells and Placement Departments** should orient students early about industry realities and career pathways.

### Conclusion

The gap between student expectations and industry expectations is not a failure of either side but a reflection of changing career dynamics. Bridging this gap requires awareness, adaptability, and collaboration among students, educators, and employers. When expectations align with realities, graduates become not just employable, but sustainable professionals capable of long-term career success.


